And... ...without using the paid Google G-suite account.

I have written this guide in the shortest steps as possible, so as to help you understand the process quickly rather than getting too overwhelmed by technical jargon. I also assume you understand certain terms - such as domain name, domain provider or registrar, hosting, email forwarding, smtp etc.

What to do first! (Important)

I'm sure if you looked hard enough, you will find a variety of ways being published to enable the same end result. However, I found this simple process, the quickest and easiest way.

Step 1

Ok! The first thing you need to do is purchase your own domain. You can register your domain with any of the many leading providers.

I have numerous accounts, but I will use Namecheap in this manual as I find them very reliable and cost effective. Please use the link above to register a domain name if you need one.

Step 2

Next you need to create a new clean Gmail account.

Note: The reason for this, is that it will be a fully verified account to yourself. Google has certain security protocols in place which can sometimes hinder the process if you don't follow things properly.



Setup your professional email alias

Step 3

From your domain account you need to setup an email forwarder to your new Gmail Account. Sometimes its called email redirect.

Firstly select your domain which will take you to your manage domain settings.



This will take you to your Email Alias settings, lower down the page



From here you need to setup your alias, I used info for the example but you can have your first name etc.

Alias Name: info — Forwards to: yourbusinessnamexyz@gmail.com

The alias will now form part of your **new** professional email.

info@yourbusinessname.xyz

Tip: Make sure you save changes in your domain account. Otherwise your new email above will not be recognised.





Testing your new email alias

Step 4

We now need to test your new email address forwards to your gmail account.

Tip: I suggest using a completely separate account to send the test. Not the newly created Gmail account, just to avoid any issues. It can be another Gmail account or another provider.

Send the email to your new professional email address. This should forward to the newly created Gmail account.

Send a test email to: info@yourbusinessname.xyz

Test email sent from an alternate account to new email address.

Setting up our Gmail Account to use our new domain name

Step 5


This is the tricky bit, so pay close attention.

In your new clean Gmail account.


Click on the cog in the upper right corner and open Settings



Open the tab "Accounts"




Scroll down to send mail as and click on add another email address







A new window will pop up with which you need to type your new professional domain email in, leave treat as an alias checked.

Click Add Account





After you click add account it will ask you to verify the account to make sure you are the owner. A code will be sent to your domain email, which should be your new Gmail account.



Keep the above window open select the window with your messages and you should have received the code.



Copy the Confirmation code and paste it into the verification box Click Verify




Go back to your Gmail account settings and then select accounts





You should now see that your new professional email has been added to your accounts section.



- Scroll to the right of your page and click make default
- Your new domain email should now say default



All you need to do now is test it out....
